So, it is a wonderful day for art, since this initiative of the **Shoah Film Collection** would like to open new doors in dealing with the Shoah or Holocaust by using new technologies and contemporary approaches in art and for artists!

So, it is a wonderful day for the artists and in the same way for art lovers and all culturally active people like you.

It is a wonderful day!

How many of you were coming, while the topic of Shoah or Holocaust is really so very heavy like the weather today.

After World War II, it was said, art would be dead, but, obviously it was not like that, then it was said, the Holocaust would not be representable, at all, for all times. There are some, but not too many examples, that this is not completely true. But the new technologies, especially the use of interactivity and moving images in art opened the door for representing processes.

From my personal point of view, understanding the Holocaust means understanding the processes the victims were undergoing, starting from the simple discriminations in all day life to the dehumanizing escalation of the industrial extermination of millions of humans based on an insane ideology.

The new vision on the SHOAH as a conglomerate of multi-facetted processes allows artists to experiment with new approaches by focusing on the details of human life.

You have the opportunity to meet eight of the wonderful 40 artists which currently are forming the basis of Shoah Film Collection, by name Doron Polak and Eitan Vitkon from Israel, Shelley Jordon, Jan Needham and Ben Neufeld from USA, Felice Hapetzeder from Sweden, Doris Neidl from Austria and Cristiano Berti from Italy.

Therefore, my special thanks go at this stage particularly to the Embassies of Israel, USA, Sweden and Austria who made the presence of these artists only possible.

So, this is really a wonderful day.

But A Virtual Memorial Riga 2012 is placing Shoah Film Collection in the context of complementary interventions. I am really happy to invite you now to the opening of three exhibitions at the floating art gallery of NOASS who stand under the motto: "How Memories Survive".

The photographs by Eitan Vitkon in the upper gallery show in an experimental and magnificent way documents of the performance Doron Polak was preparing for Riga, since Riga is the place of his ancestors. In Riga, there was the ghetto where his father was imprisoned by the Nazi and, thanks GOD, survived.









The lower gallery is presenting drawings by the Italian artist Paolo Bonfiglio, a small selection from more than 10000 of these handmade drawings he created for his animated film "Mortale", one of the highlights of Shoah Film Collection, its exhibitions and screenings.

The third exhibition component is representing the installation of Shoah Film Collection on flat screen monitors placed in the context of both exhibitions. All the exhibition components complement each other. Each of them intends to give relevant background information about the "making of", thus for a substantial understanding of the films.

Following in short will another artistic highlight, the performance by Doron Polak from Tel- Aviv which he was planning for Riga already since some time pointing to the family roots in Riga based on the diary of his father he made during his time at the Riga Ghetto.

What a wonderful day!

For art, since the opening is just the starting point to three days of interventions, starting today, continuing tomorrow, Saturday and Sunday, on 19h with artists talks, lectures and discussions completed by the screening of 6 compilations presenting all films and videos from Shoah Film Collection, beginning each days on 9.30 at night.

While the exhibition is lasting until 8 June, I will have the honor to present Shoah Film collection and its initiative as an intervention also during the International Conference of Holocaust Museum taking place on 4 and 5 June at Academy of Sciences.

So, this will be the next following highlight and I am really very proud to be part of it.
