GENERATION LOSS is a platform that seeks to posit parallel traditions and tendencies of "experimental cinema," "extended cinema," "live cinema," "video art" and other creative practice spun from screen- and time-based media to coax/suggest a need to renegotiate imposed Western definitions of art based on format and schools of thought, versus the organic and culturally-directed development of these art forms elsewhere, and particularly in the context of the Philippines.

Generation loss is a technical term referring to the loss of quality between subsequent copies of data. This platform will attempt to address issues of archiving and archive usage, cultures of re/production and re/distribution, technology, education, piracy and intellectual copyright, personal and public memory among the various creative moving image practices employed in the region today.
